



Agro Industrial Santa Isabel wants to become an important learning facility about coffee for people from all around the world. With this purpose in mind, the Welchez family decided to build a tour through the plantation where everyone can learn all about the efforts that go into making a high quality cup of coffee.





The tour begins in the visitor center, where tourists wait to be picked up by an old truck named “baronesa”. Baronesa was the name given to the trucks that would transport the coffee pickers during harvest season. The truck take he tourist up through the mountain until they reach the beginning of a 1.5 kilometer trail which they will walk with a tour guide.

The tour guide is bilingual, fluent in English and Spanish. In the farm we are constantly looking to for opportunities to train guides to provide the tour in other languages. The tour guide describes the process starting with planting the coffee plants, letting them grow, the plant requirements, coffee varieties and harvest picking. In the trail the visitors are also able to appreciate an exuberant tropical rainforest where birds and other small mammals live.



Restaurante Las Cascadas

Just when a small break is needed, the tourists reach a small restaurant in the middle of the forest named “Las Cascadas”. In here tourists can relax and flavor some Honduran traditional food. The meal includes a small appetizer, a main course, dessert and of course we cannot forget about a nice cup of coffee. The items in the meal include many artisanal fresh-made foods such as sour cream, cheese, tamales and tortillas.





After the meal, the tourists proceed to learn about what happens after the coffee is harvested. They learn about the wet and dry mil and different preparation methods.

To promote people to visit the farm, we have shuttle services from and to Copan Ruinas (which is located 30 kilometers away).
